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A VICTORY WITH WISDOM.

Before Gov. Tilden's formal retirement, says the New York World, his name was on the lips of Democrats in all parts of the country as the fitting candidate for the Presidency.

The Saratoga Convention was a Cleveland Convention. It had two courses before it; the one, to stamp out opposition by the iron power of the majority; the other, to treat the disaffected elements not only fairly but generously.

In adopting the latter policy the Convention proved its wisdom and its true Democracy. It showed that its object was, not to advance the interests or the glory of any particular faction, but to do the utmost to secure the restoration of the Republic through Democratic success.

The opposition to Gov. Cleveland does not spring from any doubt of the sincerity of his reform principles, but from a conviction of their steadfastness. He is opposed, not because he is not independent enough, but because he is not dependent enough.

Such an opposition may be fierce and noisy, but it will not be lasting. Indeed, its very existence proves the availability and strength of Gov. Cleveland as the leader in a battle for honest government, of Reform against Corruption.

A few Democratic leaders of influence and high character are against Gov. Cleveland, mainly because they are the warm advocates of some other nomination. We are satisfied that such opponents will yield their personal preferences as soon as they become convinced that they conflict with the overwhelming judgment and wishes of the party.

The Saratoga Convention has spoken with no uncertain voice. It has heartily approved Gov. Cleveland's efficient and upright administration. It has photographed him in its call for a candidate "whose character and public reputation shall give to the whole people assurance of an honest, impartial and efficient administration of the laws, without suspicion of personal end or private interests."

In other words, it presents the name of Grover Cleveland to the Democracy of the Union as the choice of the party of the Empire State, and it gracefully waits for those who have petty local and personal grievances against the Governor of New York to yield a voluntary and honest support to the foremost and fore-ordained Democratic candidate for President of the United States.

Great Britain proposes to fund her 3 per cent. consols into new stock bearing 2 1/2 and 2 3/4 per cent. interest, exchanging the 3s for 2 1/2s at the rate of £108 for £100, and for 2 3/4s at the rate £109 for £100. The conversion is quite optional; but the 3 per cent. consols have been for so long a time looked upon as a part of the British Constitution, and a direct descendant of Magna Charta, that to convert them in any way or form is regarded as a sacrilegious blow at the rights and liberties of the free-born Englishman.

The number of colored Catholic nuns in this country is slowly but gradually increasing. They are known as Oblate Sisters of Providence. The organization was instituted for the amelioration of the condition of the colored race in this country, as well as for their spiritual and temporal welfare.

Senator Fair positively denies that he has any intention of remarrying the wife from whom he was separated a year ago. A singular feature of the case, says the Washington Capitol, and one not generally known to the public, is that in addition to the \$4,000,000 demanded by Mrs. Fair upon that occasion, the Senator voluntarily added a fifth. To this appeal he at once responded, and now, though separated from Mrs. Fair, yet he has entire charge of her money affairs, investing her large capital entirely according to his own judgment.

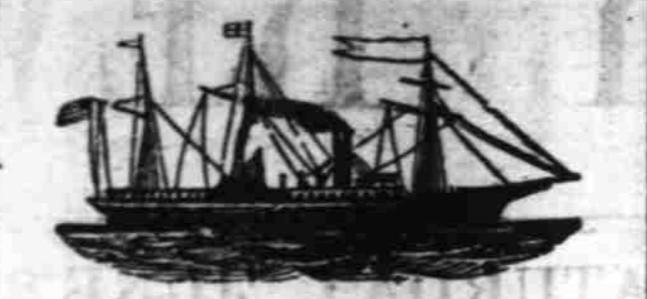

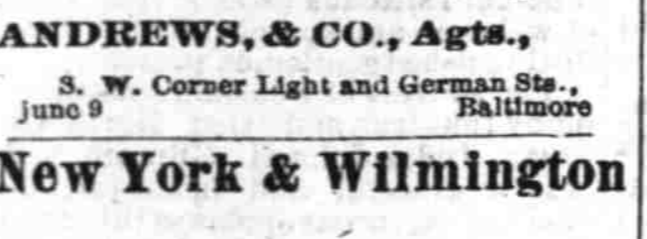

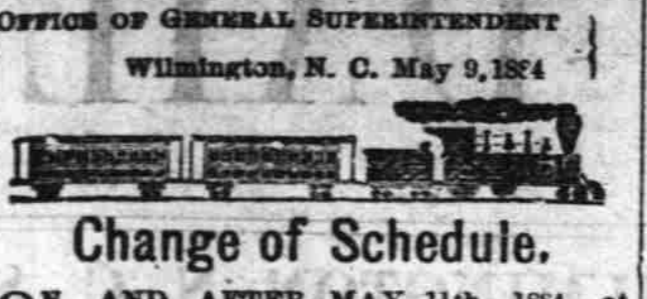
