### Quarantine Notice.

QUARANTINE FOR THE PORT OF WIL mington will be enforced from May 1st to

November 1st, as follows:

Pilots will bring all ve-sels from Ports south of Cape Fear to the Quarantine anchorage; also, all vessels which have had any kind of sickness on board during the passage or on arrival, and will cause a signal to be set in the main rigging on the port side, as soon as possible after crossing the Bar

No vessel must leave the Quarantine anchorage, or allow any person, steamer or tag boat, lighter, or boat of any kind to go along si e, unless by written anthority from the Quaratine Physician; and every vessel must be an chored as far to the eastward of the channel as is consistent with safety.

Regulations governing vessels while in Quarantine may be had on application at the office of the Quarantine Physician at Smithville Applications for permits to visit vessels in Wood or Dr. Geo. G. Thomas, and permits so abroad." obtained will be end reed by the Quarantine Physician, if, in his opinion, it is proper and safe to allow communication with such vessels. A penalty of \$2 0 for each and every offence, will be enforced against any person violating any of the Quarantine Regulations of the Port.
