Wellington's Charger. I was walking in the Strathfieldsaye park with him (the Duke of Wellington's late son) one afternoon.

By the way," he said, "do you know the famous 'Up, guards, and at them!' is not my father's at all, but Lord Saltoun's, and the right words are: 'Up, guards, and fire low!'"

My father sat Copenhagen fourteen hours at a stretch at Waterloo. He was a horse not much to look at, but of great endurance and spirit.

The duke got him in Spain, and rode him through his Spanish campaigns; he was very fond of him. For years before he died he was kept here as a pet, and the ladies were all proud to ride him up and down the terrace, in order to boast of having sat on his back.

He was buried very early in the morning. All the servants turned out, and to their surprise the duke, who was then very old and failing, got up and appeared at the funeral.

When the horse was brought out he immediately noticed that one hoof was off. He was very angry, but could not discover the robber. Some months afterward he thought he should like a hoof and had Copenhagen dug up, but his three remaining hoofs had rotted away.

A farm-laborer hearing of this asked to see my father, and told him that he knew the man who had done the deed, for he had himself bought the hoof for three shillings and six pence.

In this way the duke recovered Copenhagen's hoof, which he had set, I think the duke said, as an inkstand. - Contemporary Review.

Clever Counterfeiters. An official of the Secret Service department of the United States Treasury at Washington has been showing an Inter-Ocean correspondent some specimens of the clever work done by counterfeiters.

We quote from the correspondent's account: "There's another that may interest you. It is a \$5 National Bank note raised to \$100. You see the figures and words are just as plain as though they were originally printed there.

The raising is very common. Here is a \$1 raised to a \$10, and a \$2 to a \$20. The process is to erase entirely from the bill, by means of acids and other chemicals, whatever may be necessary to the change, and then to put in the new amendments by printing, or perhaps sometimes with a pen. Such bills do not often deceive men who are accustomed to handling money, because the body of the engraving on both face and back for the various denominations is entirely different.

Now you can tell at a glance that this hundred is simply a \$5 bill, and it is good for the amount at the bank of issue, or the treasury would issue a new \$5 bill in its place. It is not a counterfeit. So that a \$20 bill is good for \$2, and the \$10 for one. Such bills can only be passed upon persons not familiar with the different forms of our currency.

This applies more particularly to the National Bank notes, as there is a much nearer approach to uniformity in the appearance of green backs. This \$100 raise came into the treasury only last week.
