According to the Pharmaceutical Record, there is a turpentine farm near Live Oak, Florida, upon which five stills are operated, and work given to 250 hands. The farm includes 18,000 acres of land and produces annually 175,000 gallons of turpentine, and 14,000 barrels of rosin.

The managers of the New Orleans Exposition have been forced to acknowledge finally that their load of debt is greater than they can carry. It is over \$3,000,000. The state Commissioners and exhibitors have, therefore, determined to apply to Congress for another appropriation.

Miss Mary Custis Lee, daughter of General Lee, visited the National Museum a few days ago to look at the Washington relics there that she might identify those taken during the war from Arlington. The relics were in the Patent Office from 1861 to 1862, when they were removed to the National Museum.

It is announced that Italy has replied formally to the protest of the Porte against the occupation of Egyptian ports along the Red Sea by Italian forces. In reply Italy admits the claims of the Sultan to the sovereignty of the Red Sea, but declares that she has felt herself obliged to occupy certain ports in order to protect her Italian subjects, who were imperilled by the withdrawal of the Egyptian garrisons.

Bradstreet's furnishes the following commercial summary for the past week: The late interruption in the movement of freight East from the Northwest has resulted in an accumulation of produce at Chicago and elsewhere west, and the eastbound truck lines have had, for the time being, more than they could promptly forward.

The movement of general merchandise from that city shows very little gain, but there is considerable confidence for the future. At St. Louis, New Orleans and Cincinnati trade is very quiet. Philadelphia sales are for actual wants only. In the east the print cloth makers are accumulating stocks and prices are again tending downward.
