A War Relic. On Saturday last, Mr. Frank May, who had just returned from a visit to Richmond, Va., showed us a ten cent piece which had recently been dug from the fortification known as Lee's Battery at Cold Harbor, by men who were engaged in leveling the works. It was dug from the breast works, where it was probably dropped when the fortification was thrown up in 1862, and where it had lain ever since. It was quite an old piece, having been coined in 1823.

The High School at Rocky Point. We are glad to know that this excellent school is in a prosperous and flourishing state. The school property is now owned by the Methodists of the Topsail Circuit and they are determined to make a first class institution of learning there. They have appointed a Board of Managers, consisting of Messrs. F. H. Bell, John E. Durham, and Dr. S. S. Satchwell.
