Herat, the present bone of contention het ween England and Russia, is comparatively small for a place of such paramount importance, containing barely 50,000 inhabitan's. It is situated in a slight depression on the summit of a recky ridge 2,650 feet high, forming one of the westernmost spurs of the great Safied Koh (White Mcuntains) range, which runs across Northern Afghanistan from West to East. It is surrounded by a wall which, measured from the base of the earthen mound on which it stands, attains a height of seventy-five feet, which is considerably exceeded by several of the one hundred and fifty towers that strengthen it. But these defences, though seemingly formidable, are now, like those of most Afghan fortresses, tast crumbling to decay from long neglected. The citadel, like that of Cairo, stands on a steep rock in the centre of the town. There are four bazaars, which lie just within the four principal gates.
