THE OHIO CAMPAIGN.

Prohibitionists Commencing A Vigorous Campaign—Outlook for Democratic Success.

TOLEDO, Sept. 15 1885.—The Prohibitionists to-day commence a campaign never before equalled in Ohio, or in fact national politics.

This grand system of agitation must end in making votes. How many? That's the question which agitates the Republican leaders.

In speaking with General James Comly, who is well posted on Ohio politics, he informed me that the Republican press was counting too soon on a victory which could only be obtained after a terrible struggle.

Peter Brady, Treasurer of the State and a candidate for reelection, says: "The prospects are brighter now for the election of the entire Democratic State ticket than they were at the same time two years ago."

Frank Hurd, satisfied that he will win his contest for a seat in Congress, has taken a hand in shaping local movements, and for the nonce is on top.

D. J. Locke (Nasby) has bolted the Republican legislative ticket in this district, which greatly endangers its success.

Charley Foster, or "Calico Charley," as he is better known, wants to have Sherman nominated for the Presidency so he can warm Sherman's seat in the Senate.

Ex-Senator Thurman is most prominently named for the Senate if the Democrats secure the Legislature, but it is thought he will decline the office.

Should Senator Thurman decline, there will be several applicants for the seat, but none so powerful or well equipped for a fight as John R. McLean.

With so many interests at stake this campaign promises to be the most eventful in Ohio's history, and what Ohio has not experienced in the political line in the last quarter of a century is hardly worth experiencing.
