

Last week a syndicate of capi talists from Opio, Keniucky and Missis sippi purchased a tract of 200 acres in the suburbs of Chattanooga, paying for t \$500,000, or at the rate 1 1 \$2 500 per acre- The purchasers will make extensive improvements on the property, and will develop many sites for manu factoring and business purposes the same day the representative of several English bankers purchased 160 acres of land some distance from the city limits for \$100,000. Another sale was a site for a huge steam forge, which will give employment to a lar e number

The hydrographic office in Washing ton continues to receive encouraging reports from captains of seafaring vesse,s as to the leasibility of using oil to prevent the sea from breaking over ves-els during stormy weather. Seyeral letters were received last week claiming that, with twenty gallons of oil, vessels laid in a comparatively smooth sea while a perfect gale was in progress. Commander Bartlett, chief hydrographer, is much pleased with the reports thus far received, but wishes some official trials before he announces his conclusions. It is the desire of the officers on hydrographic duty to have one of the squadrons conduct a series of experiments with oil at sea and to manding the North Atlantic squadron, to direct the experiments to be made.

Officers of high rank in the army ar, confident that no action will be taken in the matter of the appointment of a new chief signal officer for the present. It will beimposeible to accomplish any thing in the way of a transfer of the signal bureau to the civil service at this session of Congress. It is the general impression that for this reason the war department will use its influence t postpone the appointment of a new chief until after the next session of Congress. Capt. Greely will be allowed to remain at the head of the corps until the tate of the proposed changes is definitely known. In case the transfer cannot be effected, it is not the opinion that Capt Greely will be made chief signal officer. It is one of the "plums" of the service, and there is not a colonel of he line who would not willingly accept it. Gen. Hazen held the rank of colonel when he was appointed, and t is not probable that an officer of a lower rank could jump to a brigadiergeneralship.


