Henry Labouchere, in a special cablegram tr m London to the New York World, say : "I do not believe in war. When people say that war is inevitable, it is precisely the moment when there is little fear of its breaking out. Even apposing Germany were to call upon France to disarm, she would reply that she asked nothing better were Germany to do the same. The result, therefore, of the demand would be that some sort of a modus vivendi would be established. The difficulty of a disarmament, however, is that Germany has to be in position to hold her own again at France and Russia combined. The demand would therefore lead Germany to making a great effort to settle the Eastern question, and this once settled, Austria, Russia, Germany and France would possibly agree to a general plan of disas much as men. That all who see this ney armament, for their existing armaments are positively ruining them."

The committee of the educational bureau of the Canton of Berne has adopted the tollowing resolutions: Latin is not to be taught more than five years, Greek not over four years, in the high schools of the canton. Greek shall only be obligatory for the heological and philosophical students; all the other pupils, especially those studying jurisprudence and medicine, may elect between Greek and Italian, ogether with drawing. 
