Some of the incidents connected with the exercise of the suffrage by women make the judicious grieve. The excited electionsering in Leavenworth had for its motive a reported saying of a feminine temperance organizer from Indiana that the exclusive social set of the city was 'creeking with corruption." She denied making the remark, but the 'set" nevertheless determined to defeat Indiana organizer and the Woman's Temperance Union. It railied all the votes it could command for the Domocratic ticket and succeeded in electing t by a narrow majority. The princi ple involved and the relation of the contest to the public interest and welfare of the city were not such as give a high idea of the value of woman suffrage In Wichita one third of the women registered are said to have given their occu pation as "sports," and they voted solidly for the labor candidate, who was elected mayor of the city.

English cattle ranges in the West were expected by the tearful five years ago to monopolize the trade, but they are passing through the inevitable reaction which weeds out of every new industry the enterprise which lacks the advantage of personal supervision. The London Statist gives the reports of nine cattle companies, of which seven paid dividends in 1884, six in 1885 and two in 1886. From sales of 77,000 cattle in 1885 these companies fell to 50 000 in 1886, and the fall in the average price per head was nearly in proportion. In short, the bottom has fallen out of the business as far as these particular companies are concerned, and the complaint seems to be general in the case of these English companies. A year ago a number of prominent bankers in Wyo ming published a letter in he New York Tribune, in which they denied that the cattle range business was in a had way, but the facts seem to be that it has been overdone.

Perhaps the real significance of the news that the Ameer of Alghanistan is about to incite a religious war against Russia is to be found in the opportunity body who will send it to them, prewhich will thus be given to the latter Power for that double line of possible military operations which she always seems to regard as an advantage Thus and combines the most valuable nerthe military preparations which she may hereafter make can be attributed either to her purposes in Bulgaria or to ner need of being prepared against Afghanistan. It may also make it somewhat doubtful whether the feint with which she prefaces a real movement will be destined for the European or the Asiastic scene. It seems to be conceded that there is an additional ground for Russia's undertaking a foreign war in the plots which now surround the Czar's tile and fill the Empire with domestic commotion. Still, this personal danger of the ruler may render bim for the moment less eager to push ambi ions schemes for the aggrandizement of the Empire.

It is reported that the next International Exhibition, to be held in Paris in 1889, is, like that of 1878, to be adorned with a captive balloon. It is to be of enormous size; and, as in 1878, the maximum altitude reached will be about three thousand two hundred and fifty feet. But, whereas, in M. Giffard's balloon only fifty passengers were taken up at one time, the projected acrostat will carry a hundred passengers An engine of six hundred-horse power will be employed to pull the enormous mass back to mother earth. It will be remembered that the balloon of 1873 was torn to pieces in a high wind, owing to the fact that it was not kept full of gas. In the new balloon a special precaution is to be taken to preserve the tightness ot the envelope, so that the wind can find in it no hollow or wrinkle. A smaller balloon, filled with atmospheric air, is to be placed inside the large one. and the volume of this smaller balloon can be increased or diminished by means of an air-pump worked by an electric engine in the car.
