The position had been taken by some that it would not be expedient to re-elect Mr. Carlisle, Speaker of the House, while his right to a seat was undetermined, but the withdrawal of the contestant disposes effectually of any such question as

Preparations have begun in Mexico for the coronation of the Virgin of Guadalupe, which will take place next A Guaranteed Policy. December. The coronation is greatly desired by the Catholics of Mexico, and nothing will be left undone to add to the grandeut and impressiveness of the ceremony. Authority for this act was granted by the Holy See in the year 1740, but was not carried out at that time on account of the condition of the country, and the project was subsequently abandoned. Last year the subject was again agitated, when the Archbishops of Mexico, Michoacan and Guadalajara addressed a communication to the Pope asking his permission for and blessing on the coronation. On March 12 a reply was received from the Vatican, in which the necessary permission is granted, and December next set for the interesting ceremony. The three Archbishops have published the correspondence, from which it appears that one of the objects in selecting this year for the coronation was to celebrate the liftieth year of Pope Leo's first mass.


