Distinguished Strangers Coming.

The French steam frigate *Ducou dic*, Capt. Bruteil, sailed from Savannah for this port yesterday morning, and is expected to arrive here sometime tomorrow. She had intended to stop at Charleston before coming here, but on account of insufficiency of water on the bar at the entrance of that harbor, will come direct to the Cape Fear and up to this city. She was at Savannah several days, and while there was an object of much interest to the people. The officers of the frigate were treated with genuine Southern hospitality by the merchants and prominent citizens of Savannah, and we hope that our public-spirited citizens will not be found wanting in proverbial North Carolina hospitality when the frigate shall have reached Wilmington. City Court.

There was quite a large and promising docket for the Mayor's consideration this morning.

Robert Toomer, colored, for using vile, obscene and profane language on the public streets, was required to pay a fine of \$20 or go below for 30 days.

London Perkins, colored, charged with an assault upon his wife, was the next case, and it was transferred to Justice James W. King for investigation.

Samuel Gregg, colored, charged with an assault upon members of his family breaking furniture and smashing crockery, was the next, and his case was transferred to Justice E. D. Hall for investigation.

Georgiana Hughes, a denizen of the "Hollow," was uproarious, cursing the police and nearly everybody else. She was required to pay a fine of \$25 or go below for 30 days.

John Gause, colored, for committing a nuisance, was required to pay a fine of \$10 or go below five days.

One case of very drunk and helplessly down was discharged.

A Suggestion.

In view of the fact that the Governor's Guards, at Raleigh, were called out on Saturday last to quell an insurrection in the State Penitentiary, and that emergencies may arise in this city that would call for the prompt presence of the military, it has been suggested that there be an understanding between the municipal authorities and the military by which the latter may be called out at the shortest possible notice. To effect this it has been suggested that ten or twelve quick strokes of the fire alarm bell be made a signal by which the Light Infantry may know that their services are needed. As at present arranged, each sergeant has charge of his squad, and under ordinary circumstances, could call them together with but little delay, but that method might prove too slow in case of a great emergency. It may be said, and on account of the law-abiding spirit of our people with a good show of reason, that there will not be any such condition of things here, and we presume there will not, but it is well enough to be prepared. The man who builds a house does not expect that it will be burned, yet, if he is a prudent man, he will have it insured, and the same logic will apply with equal force to the suggestions we have given.

It should never be used in the treatment of wounds. In these connections artificial ice, made from distilled water, should be employed. The use of raw ice in contact with food, which is at first to be cooked, is permissible, but artificial ice is to be preferred. Raw ice may be freely used where it does not come into direct contact with food." We have both natural and manufactured ice, and can supply whichever is preferred.
