The North Carolina trandulent special Son. tax bends were bought up by their

present holders, Morton, Bliss & Co and some others, for a few cents on the dollar. Their face value is about \$10,000,000 with accumulated interest to the same amount. Mr. Edward L Andrews, counsel for the bondholders, says:

"As the interest has been allowed to accumulate. I should advise that the bondh lders present the State with the \$10,000 000 of accumulated interest, and in addition reduce the rate for the future from 6 to 4 per cent, which would make an aggregate reduction of the State's liability by \$13,000 000. I believe that this is the most favorable settlement which the State can get, and consider it liberal. Four hundred thousand dollars per annum could be easily collected from special interests without being at all burdensome."


