Under this amendment twenty three compas nies now receive the appropriation. tions for two companies uncalled tor.

The Governor has accepted as No. 24, under this provision, the Charlotte Light Infantry (col); No. 25, the Mt. will be armed and equipped at the earl jest possible moment, but none except Nos 24 and 25 will receive the annual appropriation of \$300 each, since the law restricts such appropriation to twenty-five companies.
