> A successful exhibition of a street car propelled by electricity from storage batteries placed under the seats was made in Philadelphia on Thursday last. The batteries, which were manufactured in New York, consist of eightyfour small cells, each being of the size of about one-quarter of a cubic foot The track upon which the car was run is 1 000 feet in length with four curves, one of which has a radius of thirtythree feet. Immediately, upon leaving this curve a gradient commences with a rise of 5 per cent., which is fequal to 264 feet per mile. There was no brake used, the car being controlled entirely by electricity through the medium of a small handle, which was turned as the occasion required so as to regulate the speed, stop, or start the car as might good things from beginning to end.
