Peach of Boston, Mass., the first volunteer soldier from that State in the rebellion; Robert McKinstrey of Dutroit, Mich., who lost a leg in th Amry of the Potomac; Thurman I Allen, the Alameda blacksmith, of A ameda, Cal.; General William H Davis of Philadelphia, Franz Sigel o New York, the foremost German so dier of the war; General Buell of Ken tucky, Charles A Zollinger of Indiana polis, a splendid specimen of the Ger an-American soldier, and so of hrough the entire list. The same care has been manifester

for the interest of the soldier in th home office, at the head of which was placed General John C. Black. He entered the army as a private soldier, passed up through the grades, serving throughout the entire war from the firing at Fort Sumter to the surrender at Appointtox. He was thrice severely wounded, and dangerously so at the battle of Pea Ridge.


