Minnesota's high license law has been in effect a month and has resulted at Minneapolis in lessening the number of saloous, while bringing more money into the treasury, and indirectly in suppressing Hegal liquor selling. Last year 334 saloons, at \$500 each, paid in \$167,000, while this year 196 saloons have paid in \$1 000 each It is estima. ted that nine more sal ons will take out censes this year, so that \$205 000 will be realized. The leading saloon-keepers say that they are willing to co-operate with the city authorities in putting down the illegal sale of liquor, and have formed a 'legal retail liquor dealers association" to protect their interests and to see that the laws relating to the business are entorced.

Col. Henry Fad, of St. Louis is con-Ildent that electricity will supplant gas for illuminating purposes within the next decade, and that the pipes now used for the transmission of illuminating gas will, during that time, be given up to the uses of fuel gas. The present illuminating gas companies will go into the business of manufacturing fuel gas, and will not be ruined by the advance of electricity. For fuel, gas will have be jealous .- E och. to be manufactured. Natural gas will not supply the demand. The natural gas wells are becoming exhausted, and supply. Baby life insurance is becoming quite extensive. There are over 300 000 children between one and twenty years old insured in the United States. Four companies carry this business. are mostly children of workingmen and the insurance is usually carried to detray tuneral expenses in case of death A baby cannot be insured until it attains the age of at least one year. The premium is paid, as a rule, weekly, and is five cents a week in all cases. In case the child dies within three months after the issuance of the policy it is void Death after that time gives the benefi ciary a just claim against the company. If the child dies within one year the benefit amounts to \$14; second year, \$19; third, \$24; fourth, \$28; fitth. \$31; sixtb. \$35; seventh. \$40; eighth, \$50; ninth, \$60; tenth. \$70; eleventh. \$90, and twelfth year \$123. The policy may be carried on until death. When the child's seventh year is reached the premium may be increased to ten cents a week, when the death benefit will be
