Remarkable Crystals.

Some remarkable crystals were found a short time ago in a gravel bed near Mokeumne Hill, Cal They are of such hardness that the hardest file doesn't make the least impression, and they will cut glass like a diamond. All the specimens are hexagonal cubes terminating in pyramidal points, the sides being as smooth and regular as the finest cut glass, and of such clearness that objects can be plainly discerned through pieces a foot in thickness. They are of immense size, the largest having thirteen points starting from a single base tree feet in length two and half feet in thickness and weighing 500 pounds, the next in size is two feet long, eighteen inches in thickness and weighs about 160 pounds; the others, about two de en in number, range from one fo to one and a half feet in thickne and weigh from fifty to sevent


