The Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, who have taken up the case of their dissatisfied members on the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Road, stand apart from the Knights of Labor and the Federation of Labor as an independent national union.

The management of the Brotherhood under President Arthur, who is an experienced Scotchman, is very conservative. He is opposed to the policy of strikes, and can hardly ever be induced to countenance them.

Justice Harlan, of the United States Supreme Court, in his speech at the Chicago Union League banquet, took occasion to emphasize the need of an adequate judicial force to dispose of the rapidly accumulating business coming before the national tribunal.

There were before the Court in 1803 only 51 cases; in 1819, 131, of which 53 were decided; in 1860, 310, of which 91 were decided; in 1870, 636 and 280 disposed of; in 1880, 1,202 cases and 365 decided; and in 1886 the number had increased to 1,396, of which 451 were decided.

Thus the Court is getting farther and farther behind. One great cause of this increase in business is the present disposition to drag all sorts of cases before that tribunal which properly belong within the jurisdiction of the State.

Justice Harlan's remedy would be, not a division of the Supreme Bench into sections, but the establishment of an intermediate Court which shall sift out and decide many of the cases that now may be brought before the Supreme Court.

Roumania seems to be the only one of the parties to the Balkan controversy that has achieved any substantial gain from the later diplomatic moves; but she has had a single purpose in view, and has been able to show that it is for the interest of at least one of the great Powers to support this purpose.

She has notified the Porte that Austria gives her assurances that a Russian violation of Roumanian territory would be considered a movement against Austria and a cause of war. The march of Russian troops into Roumania would not only be aggression of a positive kind, but would specially threaten Austria's own defenses.

It is a safe conclusion, therefore, that it would be resented by the latter as a hostile movement. Still, to make a hypothetical case and act upon it by a specific promise is noticeable, and Austria's purpose is presumably not only to warn Russia, but to increase her friendly relations with Roumania.
