STATE CONVENTIONS.

1. The State Convention shall be composed of delegates appointed by several county conventions. Each county shall be entitled to elect one delegate and one alternate for every one hundred and fifty Democratic votes, and one delegate for fractions over seventy-five Democratic votes cast therein at the last preceding gubernatorial election; and none but delegates or alternates so elected shall be entitled to seats in said convention: Provided, That every county shall have at least one vote in said convention.

GENERAL RULES. 1. Such delegates (or alternates of absent delegates) as may be present at any Democratic convention shall be allowed to cast the whole vote to which their township or

county may be entitled. 2. If no delegate or alternate shall attend a State convention from any ounty any person appointed by the President of the county convention, or on his failure by its Secretary,

may represent the county. In all conventions provided for by this system, after a vote is castthere shall be no change in said vote until the final result of the ballot shall be announced by the chairman of said convention.

4. All Democratic executive committees shall have the power to fill any vacancy occurring in their respective bodies.


