Morgan and Pugh, of Alabama; Coke and Reagan, of Texas; Colquitt, of Georgia; Berry and Jones, of Arkansas; Harris and Bate, of Tennessee; George, of Mississippi, and Gibson and Eastis, of Louisiana.

The Democracy of New Orleans have gone into the municipal contest with divided forces. The friends of Gen. Nicholls, who is the Democratic nominee for Governor, triumphed in the recent primaries in New Orleans, and have formed a ticket made up of the adherents of Gen. Nicholls, with the Hon. R. C. Davey as the nominee for Mayor.
