Wheat never looked better at Senate went into secret session. this season of the year and the pros-When the doors were reopened a pects for a good fruit crop are fine. bill was passed to perfect the quarantine service of the United States, It imposes a punishment of fine of not more than \$300, or imprisonment for not more than thirty days, or both. upon any person, master, pilot or owner of a vessel entering any United States port in violation of the quarantine regulations framed under the act to prevent the introduction of infections or contogious diseases into the United States It provides for the establishment of additional quarantine stations at the mouth of the Delaware Bay, the entrance of Chesapeake Bay near Cape Charles, on the Georgia coast, at or near Key West, and at several Pacific coast points. Appropria-tions are made as follows: For the construction and maintenance of quarantine stations-at Delaware Breakwater, \$75,000; Cape Charles, Va., \$112,000; South AtlanticStation. (Sapelo Sound), \$38,500; Key West, \$38,000; Gulf Quarantine, (formerly) Ship Island), \$15,000.




