The War and Navy Departments, pursuant to a resolution passed by the United States Senate, have been making estimates regarding the cost of the retired lists. The highest amount which has been paid to any retired officer now living is \$104,000, received by Gen. J. C. Robinson since he left the army.

The policeman's life in New York is not a healthy one. The police report for 1887 shows that there was an average of 88 on the sick list every day out of a force of 3,232. Their ailments were chiefly of those kinds that are caused by exposure to the weather, especially during the night service, such as bronchitis, rheumatism and malarial fever.

Mrs. Maria E. Beasley, of Philadelphia, has made a fortune from the most remarkable invention which the mind of a woman ever conceived. In 1884 Mrs. Beasley took out a patent for a machine for the construction of barrels. Up to that time barrels had been made almost altogether by hand.

Very few people have any idea of the vast areas of Government land held by alien land-holders in the United States. The largest tract, 4,500,000 acres, is held by the Holland Company, of New Mexico. An English syndicate holds 3,000,000 acres in Texas, Sir Edward Reid and a syndicate in Florida own 2,000,000 acres; 1,800,000 acres belong to an English syndicate in Mississippi, 1,750,000 to the Marquis of Tweedale, 1,300,000 to the Phillips-Marsall Company, of London, and 1,600,000 acres to a German syndicate. These comprise the larger landholders. There are, however, a score or more of persons and syndicates owning less than 750,000 acres. The grand total foots up to 30,747,000 acres of Government land held by aliens in the United States.

A disclosure exceedingly uncomfortable for the relatives and friends of the English soldiers killed in Egypt has been made by the captain

of the Austrian vessel Dub, which arrived at Aberdeen the other day, loaded with bones for fertilizing purposes. The captain said he had got his load from Alexandria, and that the bones all came from Cairo. He thought they were the bones of giraffes, buffaloes, antelopes, &c., but he was obliged personally to watch the loading of his ship and reject complete human skeletons that were brought to him. The natives were very indignant at his refusal to accept the bones of Christians, and said it was their custom to dig on battle-fields and pull the bodies out of shallow trenches. It has been found that in spite of the captain's precautions the cargo of the Dub contains the bones of many English soldiers, the natives having resorted to the simple method of pulling the skeletons to pieces, and presenting them minus heads and hands, when they found complete frameworks to be unaccepted.
