An expedition was sent out last month by the Royal Irish Academy to ascertain the nature of animal life in the Atlantic at a depth of 300 fathoms. Its discoveries confirm the conclusion reached by the scientific expedition of 1873 in the Challenger, that practically the distribution of marine animal life has no depth or limit. The Challenger expedition dredged to depths exceeding 2,000 fathoms, and that in the Flying Falcon have sent down the trawl 1,270 fathoms. The animal forms brought up from such depths show that life is possible on the abyssal regions of the ocean. One very frail living form has been dredged up from its home at a depth of three miles, in almost absolute darkness, at temperature near freezing, and where the water pressure is about three tons to the square inch. The interesting work of the Irish expedition will fill an important gap in deep sea biological researches.

Some interesting figures in regard to salaries have been elicited in a suit now in progress in Brooklyn against a baking powder company. It was shown that the president of the company draws a salary of \$50,000 a year, the vice-president \$30,000 and the treasurer \$6,000. The president of a paint and varnish company who was introduced as an expert in regard to salaries, stated that the superintendent of his company received \$50,000 a year, whilst the yearly business did not exceed \$3,000,000. Another witness stated that in companies with which he was acquainted the chief executive officers received from \$5,000 to \$50,000 a year, whilst the representative of a kerosene oil company said that he knew one officer of a large corporation who received a salary of \$30,000 a year, and two others who received \$20,000 each. These figures are enormous, and were unknown until the days of trusts and combinations. The explanation is furnished in the testimony of one of the witnesses, who said that the business of the company with which he is connected had been increased until the profits had reached 450 per cent. on the original capital stock.

Since the Etruria's feat in making the quickest transatlantic passage is still a nine days' wonder it may be of interest to note the opinions of the commanders of the principal Atlantic steamers on the question whether or not fast or slow steamers may be considered the safer. According to an article in the North American Review the steamship commanders are almost unanimously in favor of fast steamers, for the reason that the less time on the voyage the less risk and that in case of bad weather fast ships can keep head up to the wind and sea and so may advantageously meet the high waves often encountered on the Atlantic. They all admit, however, that great caution should be exercised during a fog and deprecate the fact that while the speed of steamers has been increased nothing has been done in providing them with suitable sound signals for use in foggy weather. A fog is the most serious peril of an ocean voyage, and the adoption of an international signal code would materially minimize the danger.

When millionaire James Lick, of California, provided in his will for the erection of the most completely equipped astronomical observatory in the world on Mount Hamilton he had every reason to expect that the lands and goods which he had devised for the purpose would furnish ample funds not only to build the observatory, but to pay all expenses of its maintenance and operation. This provision turns out to have been unwarranted, since the trustees of the Lick estate, in their final accounting, report only about \$90,000 remaining of the observatory fund, \$750,000 having been expended in construction and equipment. The income of this residue will scarcely pay one-fifth of the cost of operating the observatory, which will be about \$30,000 a year, and the State Legislature is to be appealed to for an appropriation to make up the balance. It would be a serious drawback to the progress of scientific investigation if the use of the largest and best refracting telescope in the world should be prevented because of financial reasons. The generosity and liberality of Californians are proverbial throughout the country, and it may reasonably be anticipated that before long the embarrassments which surround the Lick Observatory will be dispelled and swept away.
