IN CONGRESS YESTERDAY.

WASHINGTON, June 15. — Senate not in session.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Senate amendments to the bill authorizing the construction of a bridge over the Tennessee river, near Knoxville, were concurred in and the bill passed.

Mr. Townshend's motion to consider the Army Appropriation bill was defeated, and the House proceeded under the regular order (being the business on the private calendar), Mr. Townshend giving notice that he would call up the Appropriation bill to-morrow.

Mr. McCreary, of Kentucky, a member of the Committee on Foreign Affairs, stated that Minister Pendleton, in a dispatch to the Department of State, had announced the death of the German Emperor. He then offered the following resolution:

Resolved, by the House of Representatives of the United States of America, That we have heard with profound sympathy of the death of the Emperor. He was distinguished as a soldier, having been made Field Marshal for his conspicuous services in the Austro and Franco-Prussian wars. He was a friendly advocate of friendly and liberal policy in Germany, and we express our respectful sympathy for the German nation in the loss of their great and renowned ruler.

Statesville Landmark: At Statesville College at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon Mr. W. W. Walton and Miss Fannie Everitt, principal of the institution named, were united in marriage in the presence of a small company of relatives and immediate friends, by Rev. W. A. Wood, and an hour and a half later took the train for a bridal trip to New York. — Dr. Stephen B. Evans died at his residence on Davie avenue Tuesday night, after a long sickness. Dr. Evans was a native of Pitt county, was a colonel in the Confederate army, had lived in New Bern and moved to this place from Goldsboro twelve or fifteen years ago. He was engaged in the practice of his profession until four or five years ago, when his health failed; and though he has rallied occasionally since, he has never been able for active duty. The funeral exercises were conducted this morning by Rev. S. P. Watters.
