Edward Payson Roe, the well known author, died in Newburg New York, on Friday night. Mr. Roe was born in 1838 on the banks of the Hudson River, south of Newburg. He was graduated from Williams College and Auburn Theological Seminary. He enlisted in the war as chaplain. At the close of the war he became the pastor of the Presbyterian Church at Highland Falls, New York, where he remain. ed until 1874, when he removed to Cornwall. While at Highland Falls he wrote "Barriers Burned Away," and so great was its success and that of "Opening a Chestnut Burr," which was written to test whether he should earn his living by preaching or writing, that his true sphere in life became plain to him, and in 1874 he retired from the ministry and removed to Cornwall where he continued to live. He was authority on horticulture and wrote several works on the subject, as well as novels. In the preface to his novel "Without a Home," he tells how he came to be an author. The burning of Chicago made a powerful im pression on him, and after spending several days among the ruins and studying the striking features of the catastrophe, he wrote his first novel. "Barriers Burned Away." The sixteen works, mostly novels, which he has produced have had an aggregate sale of about 750,000 copies. Of "Barriers Burned Away," 69,000 copies have been sold; of "Opening a Chestnut Burr" 68,000; "Without a Home," 60,000; "From Jest to Earnest," 60,000; "Near to Nature's Heart," 53,000; "A Knight of the XIX Century," 53,000: "A Day of Fate," 50,000; and the sale of other works from his pen ranges from 25,-000 to 45,000. 
