

The decision of the New Jersey Court of Errors and Appeals sustaining the high license and local option law was evidently a surprise to the liquor dealers of the States but it is in line with substantially all the adjudication of the country on the subject of the power of Legislatures to regulate and restrict the liquor traffic. That power is practically unlimited as to the methods to be used in effecting regulation. The New Jersey law was contested mainly on technical points. It was claimed that the title did not express the true intent of the Act, because it designated it as one to regulate, whereas it might also prohibit, but it was held that regulation might include the prohibition of sales in small quantities, or at certain times, or to certain persons. Then it was claimed that the power to prohibit could not be delegated to the voters of a county or a town, but the Court held that the prohibition was involved in the law itself if no licenses were granted, and that the power to decide whether licenses should be granted could be delegated by local authorities or to the voters themselves. Again it is contended that this law was special fect prohibition in one county while is that all have been cured of the scrofula, license prevailed in another, but this position was overthrown by the declaration that the law applies to all counties alike and delegates the same powers to all. All the military forces of Germany are said to be in the highest state of efficiency, and the vast engine of war which has been constructed at such immense cost awaits only the touch of Kaiser Wilhelm to begin its deadly operations. The acerbity and irritation that have been manifested along the French frontier over trifling matters of dispute between the authorities of the two nations furnishes a convenient spark which may at any time set Europe in a blaze. The friction will doubtless be increased by reason of the harsh measures which Germany has adopted to stamp out French ideas and influence in the two conquered provinces of Alsace and Lorraine. Among these are the suppression of the study of the French language in schools or by private tutor, the abolition of French money as the commercial medium of business transactions, and the threat of expatriation which hangs over the heads of the large landed proprietors. This latter measure would be resorted to reluctantly, if at all, yet it cannot be doubted that the ultimate intention and desire of the German Government is to destroy the large landed estates in these provinces by cutting them up into small buildings, to be occupied by a new infusion of fully Germanized peasantry. If the critical sentiment of the age will permit, Alsace and Is Unsurpassed Ly any in the city as to Qail-Lorraine as French communities may vet be as completely extirpated as Prussian Poland has been.
