# The Tribune's London dispatch

says that in demanding from Lord Salisbury reparation for Lord Sackville's conduct in the Marchioness letter matter Mr. Phelps enforced the point that in treating his correspondent as a British subject entitled to advice, notwithstanding his statement that he was a naturalized citizen of the United States, the British Minister had violated the agreement between the two governments recognizing the American doctrine of naturalization. This, says the New York Star, is one of the strongest points in the whole affair. The American doctrine of the universal right of choice of allegiance is a recognition of individual freedom that has been forced upon nearly all civilized nations.

In presuming to advise an American citizen, on grounds of British interest, Lord Sackville violated the doctrine accepted by his own Government, as well as the duty and courtesy he owed to the power to which he was accredited. This transgression on his part leaves England without the slightest excuse for refusing to promptly recall her obnoxious and meddling emissary.

Minister Sackville-West has always been a sneering and sinister figure in Washington life. His cynicism made him very unpopular during the administration of Arthur. He never took the slightest pains to conceal his dislike of American men and methods, and this sentiment has evidently been intensified by annoyance at Cleveland's retaliation message and the failure of British intrigues to prevent Chinese exclusion.

Whether England's representative was a willing and conscious victim of the Republican campaign trick remains to be discovered. He certainly was so disposed as to readily take part in the conspiracy to use British influence to prevent Cleveland's re-election, but in transgressing the naturalization convention, to which his own Government was a party, he seriously and substantially compromised himself with the British home authorities, so that neither from England nor from the United States can he expect either confidence or sympathy.
