




The deepening and widening of the ship channel from Montreal to Quebec, a distance of 160 miles, has been in progress since 1838. But the latest and most productive stage of this great enterprise dates from 1867, and its result is seen in a ship channel in the St. Lawrence of the average width of 300 feet, with an average depth of 271 feet. Since room. the process of deepening the channel from 20 to 271 feet has been in ment ring. progress, the ocean-going commerce of Montreal has increased rapidly. In 1873, 704 vessels, with a tonnage of 412,478 tons, was its extent; in 1887 the vessels numbered 767, with a

tonnage of 870,773, showing a large increase in ocean steamers. With large ocean steamers able to unload trouble of trans-shipment, and measurably independent of the Canadian Pacific, the city will doubtless rapid. ly expand in trade and population.

This liberal donation will give the new building fund movement a long step forward.
