IN CONGRESS YESTERDAY.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 30.—The Senate resumed consideration of the Diplomatic and Consular Appropriation bills, the question being on the amendments affecting the Samoan Islands.

Mr. Dolph stated that he could not conceive why the government should spend \$100,000 in establishing a coal station at Pago-Pago, unless the government should insist that all its rights were to continue. He took the position that if Congress were to interfere in the matter something very different from the pending amendment would be required. If he were asked what was to be, he would say that Congress should direct the President to insist upon the restoration by the German government of the status quo at the time of the Washington conference, and to notify the German government that the United States would not permit the Samoan Islands to pass under control of any foreign nation, and that their independent autonomy must be maintained. He saw no good reason why, if necessary, and if requested by the Samoan people, an American protectorate should not be established over them, and that, he said, would be an entirely different thing from intervention as practised by European powers on the continent of Europe. Further on he declared that the Monroe doctrine should be asserted in reference to the Samoan Islands, as they come within its terms.

Mr. Morgan spoke of the "feebleness" of the measures proposed, and proceeded to review the whole question. If the statements of the United States consular agents and officers could be relied upon, it was clear, he said, that Germany, while professing not to intend the disregard her treaty stipulations, was assuming absolute control of the government of Samoa, and had substantially set up a German government there.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

The Oklahoma bill was brought to the attention of the House.

Several other amendments were adopted prescribing the method of disposing of land in new territory, when, pursuant to special order, the committee rose and reported; the committee rose and reported the bill to the House. The first vote taken was on Mr. Payson's soldiers' homesteads amendment, and it was agreed to.

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

(Messenger Report Condensed.)
RALEIGH, Jan. 30.—The Senate Printing Committee reported that a contract, in due form, had been made with Josephus Daniels, as public printer.

Mr. LeGrand, bill to amend Sec. 1014 of the Code; Mr. Lark, to provide for the election of magistrates and county commissioners by the people; Mr. Green, to protect timber; Mr. Stubbs, (resolution) to provide for the proper representation of North Carolina at the centennial celebration of Washington's inauguration. It appropriates \$1,000 and went to Committee on Federal Relations.

The Senate refused to concur in House amendments to a bill to permit the sale of corn in certain sections between sunrise and sunset. The matter goes to a committee on conference.

The following bills passed final reading: To amend the pilotage laws as to reduce certain fees and to provide for half fees in certain cases; to divide Clinton township, Sampson county, into North and South Clinton townships; to make trespass in Sampson and Duplin counties upon the lands of persons in order to gather whortleberries, dog tongue or other marketable products unlawful, unless the consent of the land owner is obtained.
