The Philadelphia Record says: "Those British Tories who had hoped that Mr. Gladstone might be out of the way before another general election stand aghast at the promised spectacle of the Grand Old Man storming along the West coast of England in a steam yacht, stopping everywhere to make speeches on the way. Such a development of the gift of continuance has been hitherto unknown in British politics. There is not a monarch in Europe but appears small and petty beside the towering figure of the veteran Liberal leader."

The year book for 1889 of the Young Men's Christian Association, just published, contains a great deal of interesting information, including statistics of various branches of the work, reports of general officers and corresponding members, and records of progress in libraries, gymnasiums, railroad and college branches, and religious influence. In the whole world are now 3,788 organizations, including 1,284 in North America, South America, Central America and the West Indies, 2,417 in Europe, 53 in Asia, 19 in Africa and 22 in Oceania. An idea of the strength of the organization may be had from the fact that 756 associations which made reports have a membership of 159,319 persons. Mr. Theodore A. Harding, corresponding member for Maryland, W. Va., and the District of Columbia, reports as part of the work done in that area during the year two new buildings erected, three libraries started, six reading rooms opened, eight associations started and 1,000 new members added.

Mr. Charles A. Dana, of the New York Sun, has printed in his own paper, and supplies to the New York Tribune for publication, a batch of letters written by Mr. Horace Greeley during the winter of 1855-'56 to Mr. Dana, then managing editor of the Tribune and in charge of that paper during Mr. Greeley's absence in Washington. Why the editor of the Sun should have given the letters out for publication is incomprehensible, their burden and perpetual theme being Mr. Dana's blundering, his want of discretion, his disposition to make unnecessary and unprovoked personal assaults, and his awkward gift of injuring the cause he professed to be co-operating in. "I shall have to quit here or die," says Mr. Greeley in one letter, "unless you stop attacking people here without consulting me. * * * Do send some one here and kill me if you cannot stop this, for I can bear it no longer. My life is a torture to me." Complaining of an article in the Tribune pointing out the ways and means by which a British invader could overrun the South, rousing and arming the slaves, Mr. Greeley shows himself better disposed to the South than was his managing editor. "That article," said Mr. Greeley, "implied that we foment abolition as a means of weakening and destroying the South." In a subsequent letter he says again: "I charge you above all things not to allow anything to get in which seems impelled by hatred of the South, or a desire to humiliate that section. On the contrary ours is the course to renovate and exalt the South." What the proprietor of the Tribune most complained of was Mr. Dana's "dreadful" habit, as he called it, of "flinging stones at one's own crockery"—alienating friends by indiscreet and malicious criticisms. "Oh, my friend," he exclaims, "the wisdom which teaches what should not be said!"
