The Board of Audit and Finance
held their monthly meeting yester-
day afternoon.

Bills for current expenses, amount-
ing to \$4,326.81, were audited and
approved, and 83 coupons amount-
ing to \$430, having been redeemed
and cancelled, were burned in the
presence of the Board.

The New Fire Teams.

The five new horses for the Fire
Department were received here this
morning via the C. C. R. R. They
were brought here by Mr. H. B.
Fuller, and they are all fine animals.
They are all young. One
pair, those for the *Atlantic* engine,
will weigh 2,910 lb, that for the hose
reel 1,400 lb and the pair for the
truck 3,090 lb. They were turned
over to the city this afternoon.

The Coming Cold Day.

The press speaks well, of the
"Cold Day" performance to be
given here on Wednesday and
Thursday evenings of this week. It
promises to furnish lots of fun and
as a consequence many a hearty
laugh to those who may attend. In
these piping times of new Fall and
Winter goods, that is just what is
wanted to relax some of the grim vi-
sages worn in the mercantile en-
counter. The box-sheet was opened
at Yates' this morning and already
a number of choice seats have been
secured.

From Ashe County.

Front Street Market was bounti-
fully supplied with fresh meats this
morning. We noticed some beef on
Mr. Garrell's stalls that would put
Fulton Market to the blush. It was
from Ashe county and was fed on
timothy and clover. The fat on the
round of one quarter was within a
fraction of three inches thick. Mr.
Garrell received yesterday a car
load of this meat. There were 25
heifers, averaging 802 lbs in weight,
and 4 cows, which averaged 1,100
lbs. Mr. Garrell has slaughtered just
fifty beefs since last Friday morn-
ing.

The Women's Auxiliary to the Y.
M. C. A. met at the rooms this
morning at 11 o'clock and after go-
ing through the usual order of ex-
ercises, had reports from the Com-
mittees of the various departments.
The membership Committee showed

pleted the plans and arrangements
for the same.

men.
