


Walter Yates on Trial.

exhaustible. He estimates the area of the beds at over 40 square miles, containing more than 6,000,000 tons to the mile, in all the enormous quantity of 240,000,000 tons.

There are also bituminous slates connected with this coal of which: Prof. Emmons says: "From 30 to 40 gallons of crude kerosene oil exists in every ton of these slates. They are from 50 to 70 feet thick, and it is proper to state that it a better oil than is furnished from coal." These estimates were confirmed by Admi ral Wilkes in a report made by him to the Secretary of the Navy in 1859. He remarked at one time to the late Hon. Hugh Waddell, of this city, that "there is no section of country in the world, of the same area as Chatham and Moore counties, that
