vaush as if by comparatively near future of the great bridge contemplated across the Hudson river between New York and Jersey City-by its immense proportions dwarfing into a pignuy of bridges that now connecting New York and Brooklyn. It is to be of cantilever pattern; and, beginning on each side of the river, will stretch forth its huge antennæ-like arms until they clasp hands in the middle of the stream. The cost, with all the approaches, will be from \$35,-000,000 to \$40,000,060; and, immense as this expenditure is, it is confidently estimated that it will be amply justified by the handling of a vast business and the annual saving of time and labor in the shifting of passengers and freight. The Hudson river bridge will be about 20 feet higher in the clear than that across East river, and it is calculated that ten years will be required for its completion. The Democrats at the State election in Vermont returned forty two more members of the Legislature than they did in a similar contest in 1888. This fact indicates a loss of popular confidence in the Republican party, and a remarkable acknowledgment of this comes from a quarter where it was least expected. The St. Louis Gtobe-Democral, one of the ablest organs of the Republican party, owns up in this fashion; "The returns from Vermont tell a story to which the wise Republican will be constrained to listen. In the right and technical sense of the term, the party did not meet a defeat in the election. So far as regards the general result, the Republicans held their ground throughout the contest and retain possession of the field. All along the line the Democratic assault was repelled. It may, as has been intimated, justly be called a Republican victory. Yet it was not a vjetory which will bring any rejoicing to thoughtful members of the party. The old time vigor and enthusiasm of the Green Mountain Re publicans was absent Apparently the Republicans won, and the Democrats lost more from force of habit -a habit fostered and hardened by


