The badge of the Daughters of the American Revolution is a silver distaff, showing the flax, and over it a thirteen-spoked wheel of gold.

Lord Wolseley is quoted as saying that to an American belongs the honor of having written the most perfect description of a battle in the English language.

A book now under way, edited by Prof. Shaler, of Harvard, is to be called "The United States of America." It will deal with the agricultural, mineral and commercial resources and the literary and artistic achievements of the country at the present time.

Secretary Morton is reported to have observed, apropos of the bill to exterminate the Russian thistle from the Dakotas, that the measure ought to be amended so as to provide for the distribution of antidotes for snake bites, and to decree a patent method of ploughing with preambles, planting with resolutions, and gathering and garnering by legislative enactment all crops known to the farmers of the United States.

The Rev. Dr. Lafferty in a lecture at New Orleans said that at Shiloh it Albert Sidney Johnston had lived thirty minutes longer. Grant would have surrendered. He had this from Blair, then a member of the Lincoln Cabinet.

Marion Sims, a Southern surgeon, is due the establishment of a new school in gynecology, which is now admitted to be a true American invention.

The diocese of New Orleans contains probably 100,000 colored Catholics, a larger number than any other in the country. A serious schism is expected, growing out of the color question. No race lines whatever have been drawn in the past, and whites and blacks attend the same churches, the Catholic Church being the only one where the two races worship together.
