

DOG ORDINANCE.

BEIT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND Board of Aldermen of the City of Wilmington, as follows: Article I.—Animals. Sub division L—Dog Ordinance.

SECTION 1. Every owner or keeper of a dog shall annually, on or before the 10th day of June, cause it to be registered, numbered, described and ilcensed, in the office of the Clerk and Treasurer, and shall cause it to wear at marked with the registered number and year and letters "C, W.," and shall pay for such license, for a male dog one dollar, and for a female dog three dollars. All dogs running at large without such collar, and all cogs not registered, numbered, described and licensed as aforesaid, shall be killed, and every oweer or keeper of a dog who shall violate any of the provisions of the first section of this Ordinance shall be fined twenty (\$20) dollars for each and every offence.
