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By the provisions of the bill, freedom of exploration, free occupation of government lands for placer mining, a right to pre-empt quartz lodes previously held, and improved according to local customs or codes of mining; the right of way for aqueducts or canals, not less essential to agriculture than to mining, and the extension of the homestead and other beneficent provisions of the public land system in favor of settlers upon agricultural lands to lands in mineral districts, have been fully defined and established.
