EXPLOSION OF A RED RIVER STEAMBOAT. The correspondent of the New Orleans Republican writes the following account of a serious boiler explosion, on the 10th inst. Last night about 11 o'clock, as the steamer Cuba, Captain Boardman commanding, was ascending the Upper Falls, about one mile and a half above town, the starboard boiler exploded with terrific force, tearing all the fore part of the cabin to atoms, and setting the boat on fire.

FROM WASHINGTON. (Special Dispatch to the Baltimore Sun.) Impachment Rumors—Activity of the Impachment Schemes on Foot—Opinion of Reverdy Johnson—Prosecution of the Executive Against Congress—Gen. Mower to be Removed.

There is considerable activity among the advocates of impachment, and they are laboring diligently to get a majority in favor of the adoption of articles in the House that the matter may be sent to the Senate, and there to be held in terrorism over Mr. Johnson, with the view of forcing his prompt execution of the reconstruction laws in the spirit of the framers, as well as of the letter of the acts, and in hope of eventual conviction by the Senate.

THE HURRICANE IN ASIA. All the way from the Philippine Islands come tidings of the wrath of the great tornado. The storm has probably swept completely round the globe, and raged with no less fury in the Asiatic Archipelago than in the Gulf of Mexico and the West Indian seas.

THE OHIO SENATORSHIP. A letter to the Cincinnati Commercial from Columbus says: "The Democratic press of Ohio, so far as it has spoken on the senatorship, stands thus: For Judge Thurman, 187; for Mr. Vallandigham, 12; neutral, 12. Quite a number of the Democratic members of the Legislature, who are outspoken against Vallandigham, yet decline to say for whom they will vote for senator. This I have from high authority in the Democratic party."

SAFETY OF DR. LIVINGSTONE. LONDON, Nov. 25—Noon. Dispatches containing the gratifying intelligence of the safety of Dr. Livingstone, the celebrated traveller and explorer, have been received in this city today. The particulars received are few, but the Dr. is known to have been safe and well in April last. He was then exploring the waters of Africa, hundreds of miles from the sea coast.
