AW ACT

To provide for the Registration of

Voters. The General Assembly of North Carolina do en-

The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:

SEC. 1. That the Commissioners of counties shall have power (a majority of such Commissioners who are daily qualified being present), to establish, after, discontinue, or create such separate places of elections in their respective counties as from time to time they may deem expedient, civing thirty days notice thereof, by advertisement in some public journal, if there be one in their county, in these public places and at the Court House in their county.

SEC. 2. The Secretary of State shall, prior to the 10th day of September next, provide for and forward to the Countibours of Counties, suitable registration books for each election predict as established for the last previous election, and a suitable number of the blank forms of othe, prescribed by Article VI, section 4, of the Constitution.

SEC. 3. In case the Commissioners of counties shall not receive, on or before the first day of October next, a sufficient number of registration books and bank forms of oaths, as prescribed above, they shall provide themselves with the same at the expense of the State.

SEC. 4. The Commissioners of counties, or, in case no Commissioners shall have qualified, the Gaverner shall, on or before the first day of October next, select one Justice of the Peace for each election precinct in their counties, who shall act as Register or voters for such precinct. Szc. 2. That the County Commissioners or, in case no Commissioner shall have qualified, the Governor shall, on or before the 20th of October next, appoint six collectors at each preduct who shall, with the Registrar, be judges of election at the next ensuing Presidential election, and the said six electors shall take the place of the electors provided for in the fifth section of the said act and shall perform all the duties which have been conferred upon them.

Szc. 3. It shall be the duty of the judges provided for in the preceding section to provide at least three separate ballot boxes on the day of the election at their precincts for the convenience of voters, and as many more boxes as they may think necessary. Two judges shall preside at each of the three ballot-boxes, and if a majority of the judges think more boxes necessary, they shall appoint two additional judges for each additional box. The Registrar shall assist at all the boxes.

Szc. 4. The Registration book and the two copies hereinafter provided for to the judges of the election in the precinct for which he is appointed, he shall furnish one copy to the judges of each of the three boxes, and if there more boxes, he shall furnish one additional box.

Szc. 5. The Registrar shall receive one cent for each name copied from the original registration book.

Szc. 6. Any person who shall, with intent to commit a rend vote more than one time.

ment to commit a fraud shall be liable to the same penulty.

SEC. 7. No registered voter shall be challenged on the day of election, but those offering to register on the day of election may be challenged, and every person applying for registration before the election may be challenged at that time in like namer.

SEC. 8. All acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 9. The Secretary of State shall furnish a copy of this act to the Commissioners of each country.

SEC. 10. This act shall be in force from and after its passage.
