**EMIGRATION AND IMMIGRATION.**

It is somewhat strange to see it announced, on the same day, that a hundred North Carolinians have left their State for the first time in the great West; and just fifty Swiss immigrants have just arrived at Goldsboro. It is strange, too, that those leaving leave almost exclusively from Guilford, Randolph and other counties that voted overwhelmingly in favor of Radicalism and Taxation. We hear that these emigrants assert that it is chiefly high taxation that is driving them from the State. It is very clear that, in all the elections thus far held, they have voted for their own expulsion from the home of their fathers.

Very well! If these wanderers can do without us, we can certainly do without them. Still, we would advise them to remain in North Carolina. Thousands have tried "the rolling stone" experiment before them. A few have found the change profitable. But a large majority have either left the great West in disgust, or have only remained there because they could not raise money enough to pay their expenses home.
