WILMINGTON MARKET.

WILMINGTON, April 12.

The Senate met to-day, and after appointing a committee to inform the President of the result of the election, adjourned, and, resolving to meet daily at noon, went into Executive session.

From Richmond.

RICHMOND, Va., April 12.

Gov. Wells this afternoon addressed a large Republican meeting, giving the reasons for the passage of the Virginia Election Bill by Congress and attributing much of the success to his own exertions in its behalf.

FROM WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, April 12.

The President has made the following nomination:

Moty as Minister to England. Marshall, to Ohio, to Bolivia. Portfolios of Maryland, to Nicaragua; of Missouri, to Venezuela; Jos. R. Jones, of Illinois, to Belgium; R. G. Gray, of New Jersey, to Guatemala; Liberia; Kirk, of Ohio, as Minister to the Argentine Republic; Harbin, of Illinois, to Costa Rica; Hudson, of Iowa, to Guatemala; Ellsworth, colored to Hayti; Curtis, of Pennsylvania, to Russia; and Jay, of New York, to Austria.

In the last Appropriation Bill, provided none of the trustee negotiations were to be ratified, shall be ratified, and placed to the house of the President, the control of \$2,000,000, to be used as he sees fit in settling difficulties between the two governments.

The trials of various rebels, including the Alabama treaty are pending before the Senate.

The Steamer *Gettysburg*, has been ordered to sail to the anchorage off the coast of Cuba and return to the United States.

In the Supreme Court Chief Justice Chase dismissed the appeal in the McCord case for want of jurisdiction.

In the case of the steamboat *Bolton* vs. *Boone*, from the trial court, the decision was reversed with costs, while directions to dismiss the libel. The Court in this case claims Federal jurisdiction inasmuch as admiralty cases from the sea to the head of navigation.

In the case of *Brown v. General Hospital*, from Louisiana, judgment was reversed with costs. The Court decided that a foreigner not engaged in trade during war, is no more fit in business than a citizen of the United States.

Chief Justice Chase delivered his opinion in the Supreme Court in the Texas bond case, notwithstanding that the *Confederate* Texas made it a State of the Union, and the rights of the citizens and Government of Texas, still has or could dissolve that relation, and the ordinance of secession and all legislative acts in said rebellion were void; that the Legislature was in that body; that the United States bonds in controversy were the property of Texas at the time of secession, and that the bonds which required their transfer were illegal; therefore the State of Texas has right to recover the bonds and perpetual injury, and it is so held.

The Court said the Congress had right to adopt measures of reconstruction.

Grier dissented as to the merits and jurisdiction of the case, holding that Texas was not in fact a State in the Union.
