COUNTY TAXES.—The Board of County Commissioners, at their meeting on the 28th inst., decreed the county taxes for the present year as follows: Every male between the ages of twenty one and fifty years shall pay a poll tax of 95 cents...

THEATICAL COMPANIES.—Theatrical companies shall pay \$10 for each and every night they perform in Wilmington, unless they engage for a season of one month, and then the whole will amount to only \$100.

Billiard saloons shall pay a tax of \$100 per annum. Ten pin alleys, Bowling Saloons, Bagatelle, or other tables used for gaming purposes, shall, unless intended for private use only, pay a tax of \$50.

Retail dealers in liquors, vinous, or malt liquors, porters, or larger beer, shall pay 10 per cent on purchases. Wholesale dealers are subject to the same rate.

Persons distilling, spirituous liquors shall pay 50 per cent on each value of all liquors distilled from grain, potatoes, molasses and sugar cane; and a tax of 10 per cent on those distilled from fruit.

Every merchant or other dealer who has received license to carry on business, shall pay a tax of 1 per cent, to be in no instance less than \$10.

Hotels, boarding houses (unless used for educational purposes), restaurants, and eating houses, shall pay 1 per cent on gross receipts.

Gas Companies shall pay 4 per cent on gross receipts. Toll gates, toll bridges, to be 4 per cent. On gates across highways \$10.

Money or exchange, sent on notes broker, private bank, agent, foreign banker or broker, shall, in addition to the ad valorem tax on capital invested or the tax on the net income, pay \$200 if employing a capital of \$20,000 or more; if less than \$20,000, and more than \$10,000, a tax of \$100; if \$10,000 or less a tax of \$50.

Every person bringing into the State playing cards either for sale or private use, shall pay a tax of 25 cents on each deck.

Every horse or mule driver shall pay a tax of 3 per cent on his sales. Commission merchants must pay 1 per cent, on their sales on commission.

Every person keeping horses or vehicles for hire shall pay a tax of \$10. Draymen are not included in the provision.

Licensed retail dealers in spirituous liquors to pay a tax of \$70 per annum on malt liquors \$50.

Itinerant dentists, medical practitioners, portrait or miniature painters, daguerrean artists, &c., shall pay \$20, unless they can show they are residents of the State and have listed their receipts the previous year.

Every itinerant who shall sell spirituous liquors, wines or cordials, not the product of his own farm, shall pay a tax of \$50.

Non-residents, distributors or agents of any liquor, who shall sell any spirituous, vinous, or malt liquors, goods, wares, or necessaries by sample or otherwise, shall pay an annual tax of \$100, and a tax of like amount as residents on their purchases or sales of similar articles.

Ordered, That on each marriage license, mortgage deed, marriage contract, and deed in trust to secure creditors, there shall be a tax of \$1, on every other deed, conveying or contracting to convey, titles of real estate, and all other instruments admitted to registration, where the consideration exceeds \$500 and is less than \$1,000, the tax shall be 20 cents, and for every additional \$1,000, a tax of 25 cents.
