HAVANA, Oct. 26 The decree of constituent Cortes, establishing unrestricted liberty of religion in Cuba and Porto Rico, has been promulgated and gone forth as the law of the land. The document is exceedingly liberal in its terms. It declares that Spain cannot remain removed from the general movement of the European world, and adds that this consideration is most powerful for the Aptilica because they like powerful for the Antilles, because they lie near a continent where liberty of religion is recognized by law.

One clause of the decree provides that no person shall be prevented from holding office under the government by reason of religious belief. The decree was received with general satisfaction by the populace.


