CUBAN STRENGTH

Gen. Quesada has just issued a tabular statement of the strength of the "Liberating Army." According to this statement the Cuban army possesses a total strength of 61,688 men, 5,085 of whom are in the Oriente district, 7,584 in the Camaguey, and 47,000 in Las Villas.

Baron Nathaniel Rothschild, a distinguished member of the famous family of wealthy bankers, died in Paris on February 19. He was the third son of Baron Nathan Meyer Rothschild, and was born in 1812, and in 1842 married his cousin Charlotte, daughter of Baron James Rothschild.

NEW CURRENCY

The Banking Committee of the House met Saturday to frame a bill to provide for an additional issue of fifty millions of currency in accordance with the peremptory orders of the House to that effect.

DEPTH OF THE ATLANTIC OCEAN

The deep sea soundings made in connection with the laying of submarine cables show the average depth of the Atlantic ocean to be 12,000 feet. The deepest part of the ocean is on the American side, near the New Foundland banks, where an immense basin exists, whose depth is supposed to exceed the height of the Himalayan range.

The conduct of Governor Stevenson, of Kentucky, in refusing to accept the resignation of Golldady, the Democratic Congressman charged with selling cadetships, contrasts very handsomely with the hot haste in which Governor Scott, of South Carolina, accepted the resignation of Whitmore.

THE RESULT IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

The New Hampshire State election resulted in the success of the Republicans, but by a greatly reduced majority. Governor Stearns will have a majority of about 1,600 over the three opposing candidates.

THE INCOME TAX

After the assessment for 1869 is paid no other income tax can be collected or assessed without the enactment of an entirely new law. A bill passed the House under the previous question some days ago, providing for the assessment and collection of an income tax for one year only (1870), but it met with disastrous defeat in the Senate.

TEXAS AND THE AMENDMENTS

Secretary Bellnap has received a dispatch from Texas stating the ratification by the Legislature of that State of the Thirteenth, Fourteenth and Fifteenth Amendments to the Constitution of the United States, and that Senator elect Hamilton was the bearer to Washington of the official notification thereof to the Government.
