QUARANTINE REGULATIONS.—We are indebted to Mayor Martin for a copy of the recent act of the Legislature establishing Quarantine regulations for the port of Wilmington, which we give as follows:

THE STEAM ENGINE HORSES.—We are glad to learn that, by order of Mayor Martin, the horses belonging to the Steam Fire Engine have been turned over to the Company, and that they will no longer be used for city purposes.

TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES.—TAXES, &c.—Pursuant to the decision of the Commissioners for New Hanover county, N. C., deciding that J. J. Conoley and E. H. McQuigg, Esqs., and Washington Howe, Clerk, constituted the Board of Trustees for the Township of Wilmington, county of New Hanover, a meeting of the Board was called for the purpose of organizing and the transaction of business, on the 19th day of March, 1870, at 4 o'clock, P. M., at the office of E. H. McQuigg, Esq.
