A Practical Joker in Trouble.
New York, Sept. 26.
Francis J. Kipling, who was arrested in Schuylkill, Pa., Friday, on suspicion of complicity in the Nathan murder, on his own representation that he knew something about it, was arraigned before Justice Hogan this afternoon and committed for a further examination tomorrow. The prisoner protests his innocence and treats the whole affair as a joke, but the police authorities say they intend to detain him until he proves his whereabouts on the night of the murder, and intend to make him an example to others, seeking notoriety in a similar manner. Kipling appears to have manifested insanity for sometime past, and to have lived a simple, dissolute life.

Wonderful Growth.
The growth of Illinois is almost fabulous. It is one of the most striking events of this period of wonders. In 1810 the Illinois territory, then including what are now the States of Illinois and Wisconsin and a part of Minnesota, contained only 12,389 inhabitants. Two years after the admission of Illinois into the Union her population was only 55,311. In 1830 it reached 157,445; in 1840 it numbered 476,184; in 1850, 851,470; in 1860, 1,711,945; and now, in 1870, it amounts to 2,587,032, and now in one decade of 855,078, or over 50 per cent. Illinois now takes rank as the fourth State in population, being exceeded only by New York, Pennsylvania and Ohio. What another decade shall have passed, the three States named may well look to their laurels.
