LATEST FROM EUROPE

REVIEW OF THE WILMINGTON MARKET

FOR THE WEEK ENDING THURSDAY, SEPT. 29TH, 1870. COTTON.—This article, for the period under review, has experienced a steady depression, and the tendency has each day been downward, showing a decline of about 15 cents on the closing quotations of our last report.

SPICES TURPENTINE.—The market for this article has ruled steady through the week, and the price has undergone no change, though the meagre receipts, all of which have been taken—have confined operations to very narrow limits. The sales foot up only 541 casks, which were disposed of as follows:

ROBIN.—In this article we have no change to report as regards the state of the market. All grades have ruled extremely dull, and sales have been very meagre, and at concessions 10 prices since our last report.

CRUDE TURPENTINE.—The market opened on Friday at \$3 25 for Soft and \$1 25 for Hard—a decline of 25 cents on the closing quotation, for the former grade, of last week, but on the following day the market rallied a little and an advance of 5 cents was obtained, and on Monday a still further advance was conceded, since when the market has remained steady at \$3 35 for Soft—a decline for the week of 15 cents.
