Mr. Hargrove appealed from the decision of the Chair, not on any rule of the House, but on constitutional grounds. The Chair did not recognize the right of the gentleman to appeal.
Mr. French raised a point of order, that the second reading of a bill is a part of its legislative life, and it can go forward without it, and its legality must be as perfect there as in its final stage, and the chair undertakes to decide constitutional questions, upon which the right to appeal stands. The chair ruled the gentleman out of order.

Mr. Fisher presented a bill from the commissioners of Bladen for the same purpose; referred.
By Mr. Fisher: A bill, in favor of the Sheriff of Bladen county.
By Mr. French: A bill to authorize the commissioners of New Hanover county to levy a special tax; referred.
By Mr. Powell: A bill to define the duties of Judges of Superior Court in certain cases; placed on calendar.
By Mr. Fisher: A bill to authorize the Commissioners of Bladen county to levy a special tax; referred.

Mr. Houston moved to postpone the further consideration of the bill until the 16th of January. He said he did not wish to be understood as being unfriendly to the bill. The question of a Convention had not been discussed in his section during the last canvass, and as members were going home for the Christmas holidays they could have a fine opportunity to consult their constituents. The postponement asked for would not at all interfere with an early Convention if it was decided to pass the bill. It became the importance of the question and the dignity of the House that ample time should be taken to maturely consider the matter, &c.

After a lengthy discussion the question recurred on the motion of Mr. Houston to postpone the bill to the 16th of January. The yeas and nays were called, and the motion prevailed by a vote of yeas 45, nays 25.

Mr. Gregory moved to reconsider, he having voted with the majority for that purpose.
Pending the motion to reconsider the House adjourned.
