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**RIVER AND MARINE NEWS.**

THURSDAY, JAN. 6.

FROM BELOW.

Capt. Hilton, of the New York Coast Wrecking Company, who has control of the operations being made to save the cargo of the ship *Asteria*, recently wrecked on Frying Pan Shoals, inform us that there is no disposition on the part of the Company to abandon the wreck until all the cargo is removed or disappears from natural causes. The steamer *W. Meade*, with the little schooner *Meteor*, will continue the work, the *Resolute* having returned to Norfolk for repairs in consequence of leaking badly. There are still on board the ship about 1,800 bales cotton, about half the original cargo, which will all be saved unless a stiff Northeast wind sets in and breaks the wreck to pieces. The *Winants* and *Meteor* brought up 150 bales yesterday and 300 bales will be shipped by the steamship *Mary Sundown* to New York, all of which was taken from the ship during the present week.
