WASHINGTON, Jan. 26.
FOREIGN MISCELLANY.

The Germans have abandoned the siege of Cambrai.
The French have inundated the country around Douay and Arras.

A French army corps is too close on the Swiss border.
The headquarters of the north are at Besancon.

A dispatch dated Havre, Jan. 23, says the Germans, after making a requisition for forty thousand francs, shot four inhabitants and carried off the mayor and three councilmen.

Turkey declares semi-officially that the war will rest upon herself for protection and not upon the interests and jealousies of the European powers.

The London Times has a special dated at Versailles on the 25th, saying that Jules Favre is there proposing to surrender. Paris has the garbison with the exception of war.

The Times says editorially that if Favre refuses to capitulate on the German terms Bismarck has the acceptance of them by Napoleon and the Emperor, and threatens to restore Napoleon.

A heavy snow northward interrupts the travel and mails.
The Kansas Legislature has elected Alex. Caldwell to succeed Ross in the Senate.

The elements composing the reconstruction committee are so inharmonious that the committee is virtually dissolved. No measure proposed can be sanctioned by a majority, and there is no disposition on the part of the chairman to call a meeting of the committee.

HOUSE—The House is discussing counties.

LONDON, Jan. 26.
Advices of the 25th say that the presence of Favre at Versailles is unconfirmed. It is regarded doubtful on the 'Change, and Consuls fell off.

A week's adjournment of Conference is attributed to the absence of the French representative.
Still further advices announce the capitulation of Longwy with 4,000 prisoners, and 300 guns.

Bismarck has been appointed Chancellor of the German Empire.
